It is interesting to see how, with brethren who had not yet had time to mature, he was so calm and compassionate with the instructions. Justin and Joey are also continuing to study the book of Proverbs with the teenage class on Wednesday evenings. I know this has been a good study, and have seen good growth in Joey as he helps to prepare for this class.

We continue to have personal studies as we have opportunity. Over the last few weeks, I have been able to have some discussions/studies with a lady that I connected with through some of my secular endeavors. While I have had some really good discussions that have arisen through this "door of opportunity," she is the first to really be willing to have more serious discussions, and has visited with us in our assembly as well.

I am continuing to preach through the book of Hebrews. While I do not use every opportunity in the pulpit to work on this series, I have been trying to concentrate on it much more this year.
